A colleague of mine wisely pointed out that for some students, the mere act of getting out of bed and boarding the school bus is a monumental effort. Yet, we demand consistent effort throughout the day, often without considering their unique contexts.

For students to be engaged, to feel happy and safe, they need to find their niche – their place to 'hang their hat' at school. This is where they feel they truly belong. I've been exploring how academic, co-curricular, sporting, and service data can triangulate a student's school experience.
